#### **Reading and Writing to Succeed** as Entrepreneurs

Modern economy depends on a literate work force, as well as literate consumers. MicroSociety provides a context that makes reading functional and fun. When applying for jobs, students write resumes and cover letters. When running for office, students write and deliver speeches. When starting a business, students write business plans, job descriptions, company policies, ad campaigns, etc. In the courtroom, marketplace and newsroom, reading, writing, and communication skills spell the difference between success and failure.

#### Math, Economics and Financial Literacy as Survival Skills

Young citizens, consumers, bankers and entrepreneurs perform hundreds of transactions each day, elevating math to an everyday skill. Students of all ages begin to recognize that financial literacy and basic math skills are essential in order to buy and sell, create budgets, maintain checking accounts and calculate taxes. They apply geometry when measuring floor plans or making jewelry and algebra when developing spreadsheets, financial reports and profit and loss statements, and when managing taxes and payroll.

#### **Visual and Performing Arts** with a Purpose

Too often creative talents can't make it once they graduate from High School. Singers, song writers, painter and dancers put their skills to business when they view their talents in terms of dollars and cents. By learning to write business and marketing plans or grant proposals themselves or by hiring a peer for the job, artists gain deserved recognition from their peers and community while learning the skills needed to survive in the world outside of school. Everyone benefits when they do.

## **Living Social Studies** and Civic Engagement

Social studies becomes a living lesson in citizenship and government when students weigh individual wants against social needs. Students for example, forge a social contract during a Constitutional Convention, debate social issues in town meetings and hold elected officials accountable through impeachment proceedings. Coached by teachers, children even learn to resolve conflicts, negotiate, persuade, and defend their actions to avoid or succeed in court.

## Government, Citizenship and Global Awareness

Whether a manager, politician, judge or citizen; students learn the value of effective leadership and the significance of being a caring citizen. Students discover why voting and demanding ethical decisions of their elected officials is not only their right, but their responsibility. They learn empathy and respect for others while honing valuable conflict resolution skills in order to enforce the rules they create. Whether in town meetings or in corporate settings, students learn to respectfully dispute or voice their concern when standing up for their rights as citizens or employees. Self-esteem issues dissolve as students work together to make their community the best it can be.

## Science and Technology in Action

Science lessons come to life when student architects and engineers design new storefronts, when technology is applied and useful to invent or manufacture products for the marketplace or when government researchers "Micro" apply environmental science principles through recycling campaigns, public green spaces, health and wellness ventures and science museums.


